# **CHY3 Charity Tax Back**

For several years now a scheme has been in place where people who pay income tax can direct that it go to a particular registered charity. Birr Parish is such a recipient. A special form, CHY3, has to be signed by the tax paver. It applies to both PAYE and self-employed so if you have donated more than €250 to Birr Parish and are paying tax you are eligible. This scheme is at no cost to you as the money comes from the Revenue Commissioners and you have already paid it in taxes. It is an important source of income towards the running cost of the parish. By completing the form you can make a significant difference. Blank forms are available in the Parish Office or church porches.
