Tax Back to Birr Parish

A tax scheme exists whereby people who contribute €250 or more to a charity in a given calendar year can allow the charity claim an additional sum equal to almost 45% of the donations from the Revenue Commissioner. The Revenue send this additional sum directly to the charity concerned. Birr Parish has the status of a charity for this purpose so any contributions to the parish are classified as charitable donations. There is no cost or loss incurred by any taxpayer who is willing to be part of this scheme and confidentiality will be assured in all aspects of the process. In 2016, almost €19,000 was contributed to parish funds by the Revenue Commissioners. Forms are available from the Parish Office and the church porches permitting the parish to avail of the scheme. Please give consideration to this if you have not previously done so. Many thanks.

Féile Chorp Chríost

Déanaimid ceiliúradh inniu ar Fhéile Chorp Chríost. Ag Séire an Tiarna an oíche sula bhfuair Sé bás. thug Íosa a Chorp féin do na deisceabail agus dúinne á rá 'tógaigí, ithigí agus ólaigí iad seo, Mo Chorp agus m'Fhuil". (Matha 26:28). Ba é seo an chéad Aifreann. Ó shin i leith tá sé de phribhléid againn freastal ar an Aifreann agus Comaoin Naofa a ghlacadh. Léirigh muintir na hÉireann ómós agus grá don Aifreann i gcónaí fiú le linn na bPéin Dlíthe (1695-1746) nuair a bhí cosc ar dhaoine freastal àr an Aifreann. Ag an am deirtí an tAifreann ag Carraig an Aifrinn in áiteanna iargúlta agus bhí ár sinsear sásta a mbeatha a chur i mbaol le grá do Dhia. Is mó Carraig an Aifrinn atá le fáil ar fud na hÉireann. D'fhág Íosa an tAifreann againn lena chuimhne a choimeád beo agus buan dúinn. Paidir tar éis na Comaoine:

We celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi today. At the Last Supper, the night before He died, Jesus gave His Body and Blood to His disciples and to us saying "take this and eat it, this is my body, take and drink, this is my blood". ((Matthew, 26:28). This was the first Mass. Since then it is our privilege to attend Mass and receive



Holy Communion. The people of Ireland always had a great love and reverence for the Mass. During the Penal Laws (1695-1746) attendance at Mass was prohibited so the Eucharist was celebrated in isolated places using a boulder as the altar. These are now known as Mass Rocks. Jesus left us the Mass so that we keep his memory alive forever. Prayer after Holy Communion:

May the sweet name of Jesus be written in my heart, Mary, mother of Jesus, may Jesus be in me and I in Jesus. May the bond of love be always between us and never be broken. Dear Jesus, may it be thus forever. Amen
