Mí na Samhna, mí na marbh, mí titim na nduilleog, tús na bliana Ceiltí. I mí na Samhna, bí linn a Dhia. We hear this prayer at Mass to remember those souls gone before us.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord and may perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.
