Sister Mary Anthony Loughnane 1929 - 2020

An appreciation

On Wednesday April 29th Sister Mary Anthony Loughnane of the Daughter of the Holy Ghost was laid to rest in the convent graveyard at Olney, Milton Keynes, Buckinghamshire. She had spent all her adult life as a religious sister working in the area of education.

Sr. Mary Anthony was known to her family and friends as Sr. Celine, arrived into life in the year of the Wall Street Crash of 1929. She was one of a family of 11 children born to Margaret and Michael Loughnane, Tinlough, Carrig.

Celine was part of a generation of Irish women and men who entered religious life and have contributed through a lifetime of service as teachers, nurses and community leaders to generations, especially in the more deprived and poorer parts of our world.

The Daughter of the Holy Ghost is a religious order founded in Brittany, France with a charism to work with the poor. They were forced to move from France in the early 20th century and arrived in Bedford where over the past 120 years they have ministered as teachers, nurses, in social work and parish ministry. The Holy Ghost Sisters had a convent and school in Monaghan. It was here that Celine Loughnane and her two sisters Josie and Ciss began their religious formation as young students. Celine trained as a teacher and Josie, Sr. Mary Enda, and Ciss, Sr. Ann Patrick, qualified as nurses and midwives. Also from the Birr area Sr. Angela Mary Verney and Sr. Mary Joseph Verney, Crinkill and Sr. Josephine Kelly, the Green were members of the same order.

Sr. Celine was a qualified teacher and had a great love of both music and art. She was accomplished on the fiddle and accordion spending most of her teaching life in their convent school at Newtown Abbot, Devon and in parish ministry. She was gifted as a painter of icons. For the past ten years she has lived in the retirement home at their convent in Olney, Milton Keynes where she was blessed with a full and active life up to the final week of her life.

Celine was a yearly visitor to her family in Birr staying in recent years with her sister-in-law, Bessie, who also died recently.

Rest in peace faithful servant after a lifetime of making a difference in the lives of so many. May you now be numbered in the company of the saints. In iothlainn Dé, go dtugtar sí.
