Sr. Patricia Harrington Feb 27 1930 - Nov 13 2020

Sr. Patricia Harrington died peacefully on 13th November in the loving care of her community of Mercy Sisters, Kilrush. She was the eldest of five children born to Patrick and Rita Harrington on 27th February 1930 in Birr. She attended both Mercy Primary and Secondary schools in Birr and following her Leaving Certificate she entered the Mercy Novitiate in Nenagh in September 8th 1947 taking the name Immaculata.

She went to UCD where she studied French and Irish. Subsequently, she taught in Birr, Nenagh, En nis and Kilrush Mercy schools and served as Princi pal in Scoil San Sabhier, Kilrush, When she reached retirement age she continued, in a voluntary capacity, to teach those who needed special help in Irish. She did this until she was eighty and was recognised as an excellent teacher, did meticulous preparation and was loved by pupils and staff.

Patricia was a keen reader and was very devoted to doing her daily crosswords. She stayed very active until her final few months, walking every day in Vandeleur Woods even in rain - complete with umbrella. Her outlook on life was very positive.

Her 90th birthday was celebrated just before lockdown and several of her relatives from siblings to grand-nieces and nephews joined her for the celebration. She was close to her family and remembered every celebration they had.

Patricia is predeceased by her parents and brother Don and is deeply regretted by her sisters Colette Lydon and Ursula Waters and a wide circle of family, community and friends.

Feast of Christ Our King

The Feast of Christ our King was instituted by Pope Pius 1X in 1925 in response to growing secularism and nationalism. It was originally celebrated on the last Sunday in September. In 1969 Pope Paul V1 renamed the festival "Our Lord Jesus Christ King of All" to be celebrated on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year.

We are commemorating the triumph of Christ, Our Lord as King. A new Liturgical Year begins and our attention is focused on God's plan when His kingdom will come and we and our people will be with Jesus Christ in heaven, remembering that His life ended on the cross but today we honour Him as the Risen King.

May all creation praise and glorify You forever as King of all.
