Inniu an tríú Domhnach den Aidbhint agus tá an Nollaig buailte linn nach mór. Go traidisiúnta tugadh Domhnach Gaudete nó Domhnach na Lúcháire ar an tríú Domhnach den Aidbhint agus is briathra tosaigh na Loinneoige don Iontróid ná: "Bígí lúcháireach i gcónaí sa Tiarna. Gaudete Sunday

Today is the third Sunday of Advent and Christmas is near. Traditionally it is called Gaudete or Rejoicing Sunday and the first words of the Introit of the Mass are: "Rejoice in the Lord always again, I say rejoice! Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. (Phil 4: 4-5).

The theme of Advent focuses on the coming of Jesus. In the Liturgy of the Word today, we are reminded that St. John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord and joy is felt in his mission. Pope Francis in his 2014 Gaudete Sunday homily said that we should not worry too much about what we have not done in preparation for Christmas but to think about all the good things life has given us.

The priest wears rose-coloured vestments and the rose-coloured candle is lighting on the Advent Wreath. The change of colour is a reminder to increase our courage and to continue with our spiritual preparation especially through prayer and fasting.

Lord, may you give us the strength and courage to develop and foster virtue now and always. Amen
