St. Teresa of Avila

Next Friday is the Feast of St Teresa of Ávila. She was born in 1515 and was raised in an atmosphere of good example and prayer. In 1535 she entered the Carmelite Order in Ávila. God had great work in store for her. He asked her to reform the Carmelite Order. Their rule at the time was not the rule of perpetual prayer for which it was established. In 1562 she founded the first monastery in Ávila which had as its patron Saint Joseph. Before she died she had established thirty monasteries. Her writings are an important part of the Church's literature. Reflect on the following:

Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world.

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
