Month of the Dead

It is comforting to realise that our relatives have not gone away from us but gone before us and some day we will be with them in Paradise. We hear this prayer at Mass to remember those souls gone before us.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord and may perpetual light shine upon them.
