Feast of St. Laurence O'Toole

The Feast of St. Laurence O 'Toole is celebrated on the 14 November. He attended school in Glendalough. As a young boy he was religious and studious. He became Archbishop of Dublin in 1162 and his fame as a saint spread because of his self-penance and love of the poor. When the Normans came to Ireland, he made every effort to defend the rights of his country. He was on his way to make a peace settlement with Henry II when he became ill in Normandy and died there. In 1492 his head and bones were buried in Chorley, Lancashire, but were lost during the reign of Henry VII. They have not been seen since. Saint Laurence is the patron saint of Dublin.

We ask him to intercede for God's blessing on the people of Ireland and in particular for the people of Dublin. Saint Laurence pray for us.

During the month of **November** we remember and pray for the Holy Souls.
