Feast of Christ the King

The feast of Christ Our King is celebrated on the last day of the Liturgical Year. The Feast of Christ our King was instituted by Pope Pius 1X in 1925 in response to growing secularism and nationalism. It was originally celebrated on the last Sunday in September. In 1969 Pope Paul V1 renamed the festival "Our Lord Jesus Christ King of All" to be celebrated on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year.

We are commemorating the triumph of Christ, Our Lord as King. A new Liturgical Year begins and our attention is focused on God's plan when His kingdom will come and we and our people will be with Jesus Christ in heaven, remembering ,that His life ended on the cross but today we honour Him as the Risen King. This prayer is from Ár bPaidreacha Dúchais:

May all creation praise and glorify You as universal King. Jesus my King, my friend and my beloved: Jesus my protection from sin and death. Sacred Heart of Jesus may your Kingdom come.
