Feast of the Blessed Trinity

Today we celebrate the Feast of The Blessed Trinity. It is one of the great mysteries of the Christian Faith. It took the Church hundreds of years to formulate its meaning. The Nicene Creed was composed in the fourth century to clarify the adoration to be given to each Person of the Blessed Trinity. We still have this Creed and it is usually the Creed recited in the Mass. The Holy Spirit is the love of the Father for the Son. It is said that St. Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity to the people of Ireland. He showed that just as there are three leaves on one stem, there are three Persons in one God. The prayers most frequently said to the Blessed Trinity are the Sign of the Cross, the Glory Be to the Father and Church Blessings. In these prayers we join with the angels in praising God. In Baptism we received the Holy Spirit and through our Confirmation we have a mission to be faithful to the Faith of Christ and to proclaim Him to the world. This feast reminds us that we will live for all eternity in the presence of the Holy Spirit. The following prayer is from tradition:

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, May the Three in One be with us day and night,

On the high seas or on the mountainside, May our Mother be with us and be our support. Amen
