Bishop Willie Walsh

Bishop Emeritus Willie Walsh died

suddenly and peacefully at his home in Ennis on Wednesday evening last. He had celebrated his 90th birthday on January 16th and would have marked his 66th Anniversary of his ordination on Friday 21st February. A native of Roscrea he spent his entire priesthood ministering in Ennis Co. Clare, in St. Flannan's college, in the Cathedral parish, as Bishop of Killaloe and in retirement for the past 15 years. He has had a life long passion for sport and in particular hurling and has been involved in coaching hurling teams, club, college and County grades. On his appointment as Bishop in 1994 he choose as his motto "Cinealtas Chríost" the gentle kindness of Christ which was not just an idea but a description of who and what he was. He was a voice for so many people on the margins of society. During his time as Bishop he shepherded our Diocese at a period of unparalled crisis for the Catholic Church in Ireland. During the millennium year he walked across the Diocese from Loop head in west Clare to Kinnitty in the East to meet people listen to stories of brokenness and hurt and in an tangible way make repentance for the institutional churches failures. He has been a remarkable, humble inspiring Priest who walked the talk and we are all the better for his life and times. Rest in peace good and faithful servant
