In August, we celebrate the harvest. Lugh was one of the most important gods in the Celtic culture. People in Ireland often performed dances and bonfires to celebrate the August Feast. Some of these customs were still there today. According folklore Lugh was a warrior, a hero, a poet, a harpist, a diplomat, a statesman and a craftsman. August is named after him; the first month of Autumn. We thank God for everything that grows. In Celtic times it was thought that all the crops came from the sun and without it there would be no food and they would die. St. Patrick came and taught that God created the heat of the sun and the rain to help the growth of plants.
